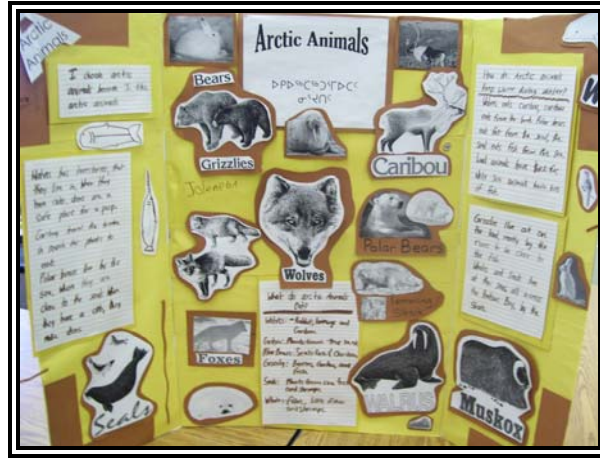

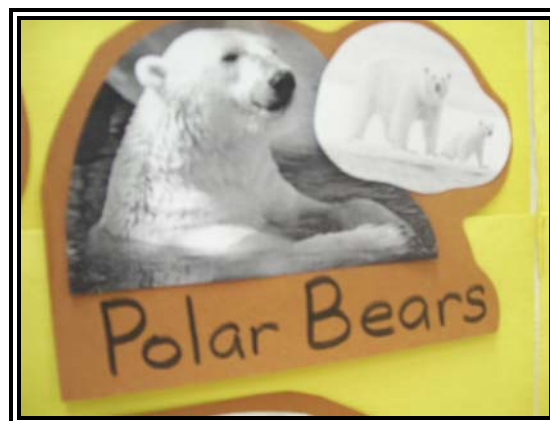


I chose Arctic Animals because I like arctic animals.

What do arctic animals eat?

Wolves: Rabbits, lemmings and caribou.

Caribou: Plants from the land.

Polar Bears: Seals, fish and caribou.

Grizzly: Berries, caribou and fish.

Seals: Plants from the sea, fish and shrimps.

Whales: Fish, little fishes and shrimps.

How do arctic animals keep warm during winter?

Wolves eat caribou, caribou eats from the land. Polar bears eat fat from the seal; the seal eats fish from the sea. Land animals have thick fur while sea animals have lots of fat.



Grizzlies live out on the land, mostly by the rivers to be close to the fish.



Whales and seals live at the seas all across the Hudson's Bay by the shore.
